Transport

Importance of transport – local links

Climate change demands public transport to Vincents/Loughlinstown hospital

Elderly people need to get town bus to go around Arklow but was not supported – now people don't have cars at the moment – give people their independence to prevent isolation – keep visible

Communication facility – keep people in the area – local link bus that goes around the town even every other day. Need more local transport because cars becoming more expensive to run

Problem is insurance, people are so afraid of people taking advantage and making claims. Insurance should not be as high on the priority list Re public liability insurance for events like public clean up. Cost of insurance is prohibitive – support from council for startup costs.

More financial support for voluntary groups – affordable spaces

Directory for Services available in Arklow

Directory of services is badly needed – people don't know what is available – not everyone has online capacity

Mental Health Policy & Practice

More counselling availability to deal with people with unseen mental health issues

Mr. Niall Breslin, need more ambassadors like that to say it's cool to chat about things

Huge stigma around mental issues

Mental Health- start at a young age e.g., national school- make it a part of the curriculum in CSPW – teach them to recognise the symptoms e.g., lack of sleep, relationships, personality change

Introduce mental health education early in schools to remove the stigma of such issues

Samaritans/Counselling/Alone – no national organisation “Talk to Tom” – its good to talk – Overall counselling strategy needed - regulated

Infrastructure

More footpaths for people to walk rather than drive

Public lighting often out of order & this prevents people from walking at night

Benches for elderly in the dog park

Lack of suitable premises for music, art, therapy services

From Knockmore Roundabout to the kisch – path of cycle path – money promised but never happened (€450,000 allocated)

Water collecting in road at Servier – after rain

Community Supports

Men’s sheds are for elderly – need to change this impression

Mother & baby clubs in the library – why not father & baby clubs

Kids spending too much time inside on consoles etc not playing outside anymore

More safe public areas -indoors & outdoors for people to meet in the evening

Lack of suitable premises for music, art, therapy services

Activities for the older generation e.g., pitch & putt/bowls

School building should be used every night and every weekend & summer months for non-school activities for community groups/sporting pitches etc

Lots of new arrivals in towns with no family connections – no family to call on when something comes up – on their own all of the time

Need more facilities like mens sheds – women will talk to each other – men wont

People need to be more friendly with each other – know your neighbour – people don’t speak to their neighbour – all too busy

More activity for elderly to get them out of their houses after Covid

Need for allotments to allow elderly keep active in gardening activity when they can’t manage their own gardens

Safety & Security

Parents too worried about “stranger danger” – people in Inbhear Mor park driving arounds the corner to Templeraíney School

Electric cars too quiet- sneak up on people -no chance to react

Cycling on footpath – E scooters too fast – not controlled
