


Background to Community Climate Action Programme




Climate Action & Low Carbon Development (Amendment) Act 2021

- 51% overall reduction by 2030
- Climate neutral by 2050

Community Climate Action Programme

- The Community Climate Action Programme is a new programme which aims to support and empower communities to take climate action at a local level.
- Through the CCAP, as supported by the CAF, Wicklow County Council will award grants from a total funding pot of €646,000 to community organisations to support citizens to step up local climate action.
- The overall objective of the programme is to shape and build low carbon, sustainable communities to contribute to national climate and energy targets.





Two Strands of Funding Are Available

STRAND 1 :Action: Building Low Carbon Communities

 Wicklow County Council have been allocated €646,000 community projects that have a direct climate action impact in a considered and structured way.

STRAND 1A: Shared Island Community Climate Action

 €3 million funding is available to support cross-border and all island climate action initiatives in partnership with a community in Northern Ireland.





Eligibility for Strand 1 – Building Low Carbon Communities

Eligible Community Organisations Must Be:

- not-for-profit organisation
- located in operational area of your county council
- registered with PPN or connected with other collectives e.g. The Wheel, Tidy Towns
 and /or a community group Articles of Association or a Constitution hold an AGM, approved minutes available

NOT eligible for Strand 1:

- Private individuals
- Commercial undertakings (including sole traders)
- Schools (possibly further clarification)
- National community or environmental organisations





What Funding Is Available?

- The Community Climate Action Programme grants can fund up to 100% of all eligible costs.
- You can apply for different size projects-small (10%), medium (40%) and large (50%)
- Projects must be completed in 18 months

| Project Scale | Project Value |
|------------------------------|---------------------|
| Small Scale Projects | Up to €20,000 |
| Medium Scale Projects | €20,000 to €50,000 |
| Large Scale Projects | €50,000 to €100,000 |





What Projects Are Eligible?

Projects must deliver a direct positive impact on climate change by:

- reducing greenhouse gas emissions,
- increasing production or use of renewable energy,
- improving energy efficiency and/or increasing climate resilience helping communities adapt to the consequences of climate change
- identifying nature-based projects that enhance biodiversity and seek to reduce, or increase the removal of, greenhouse gas emissions or support climate resilience
- assisting regions/communities within Wicklow and sectors of the economy impacted by the transition to a low carbon economy
- involving potentially innovative solutions to address the above asks.





How Are Projects Evaluated?

- Innovation & Scability (20%)
- Value for Money (20%)
- Achieveability (10%)
- Partnership Approach (10%)
- Governance Arrangements (10%)


Strand 1A

- Shared Island Relevant & Impact (30%)
- Innovation & Scability (20%)
- Value for Money (20%)
- Achieveability (10%)
- Cross-border Partnership Approach (10%)
- Governance Arrangements (10%)
- WCC will select suitable projects for consideration by the Minister (DECC)
- Shortlist of project submitted to Minister (DECC)
- Minister (DECC) has final approval of submissions
- MCC will issue letter of offer to successful applicants
- If a lower award is allocated, applicant may submit revised POW
- MCC reserves right to withdraw from a project if all requirement are not met


