We are inviting nominations for two new PPN Environment Pillar Representative position on the Bray to Greystones Cliff Walk Management Committee

Wicklow County Council is expanding the membership of the Bray to Greystones Cliff Walk Management Committee. This follows recent discussions on progressing the reopening and future management of the Cliff Walk.

As the committee continues its work to oversee the management, development, and long-term sustainability of this important local amenity, it is vital that the voice and perspective of key Bray and Greystones stakeholders are formally represented.

As part of this expansion, the PPN has been asked to nominate:

- One Environment Pillar representative from the Bray Municipal District
- One Environment Pillar representative from the Greystones Municipal District

We are now seeking nominations from PPN Environment Pillar member groups for these positions.

Please note that any nominated individual will be required to agree to and abide by the Committee's Terms of Reference, which outline the responsibilities, expectations, and scope of participation for all members. The committee intends to finalise the Terms of Reference during January.

The closing date for nominations is 9am on Tuesday 20th January.

Process & Procedure

Member Groups Please note:

Only Full Member Groups of the PPN Environment Pillar can make nominations or vote in the PPN elections for these representatives roles. These are the details we have for your group:

Type of Membership: {Contact_member_type__c}

Group Pillar: {Contact_Group_Pillar__c}

If you are unsure on any of the above or if you would like to enquire about registering your group as a Full Member of the PPN please contact us.

Where more than 1 nominee for the seat is received an election and voting process will be activated. Each Full member group of the Environment Pillar in the relevant MD will have ONE vote.

A term for a PPN Representative is 3 years with a second 3-year term allowable. Therefore, those who have completed a first term can put themselves forward for another term.

Nominees Please note:

There is a time commitment to being a PPN Representative this will include being able to (as much as possible) attend the meetings of the committee you were nominated to, attending Secretariat & Reps meetings for peer support (2 per year) and attending PPN Plenary meetings (2 per year).

Please provide a brief biography (in the nomination form) about yourself, particularly your community work experience, interest in the environment and what you'd bring to the committee.

PPN Representatives are required to provide a brief written report from the meetings they attend on the PPNs behalf. This report is circulated to all our member groups and uploaded to our website.

Representatives should be willing to link in with PPN Linkage Groups, Thematic Networks and member groups that have an interest in their committee, bringing their issues, suggestions and views to the committee they sit on (this provides WCC with information from community groups)

We will be accepting nominations for this new PPN Representative positions until 9am on Tuesday 20th January.

Role of a PPN Representative

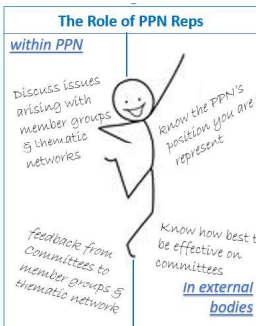
What is a PPN Rep?

PPN Representatives perform an important function on behalf of PPNs.

They are elected by Member Groups in their College / area to get involved in, and contribute to, Local Authority Boards or Committees on behalf of the PPN. In doing this, they represent the PPN as a whole, their own Municipal District / area, their College and their group.

Why have PPN Reps?

- Local knowledge and expertise is inputted into the decision making arena,
- Development of local inclusive solutions to local issues,
- Creates opportunities for the wider community to contribute to the local authorities policies & plans
- Public participation will lead to improved quality of decisions.
